SUMMER YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

In this placement the student will be leading Andrew Fleck Children's Services summer leadership program with youth 13 to 16 years of age. The focus of this placement will be on selecting, orienting and mentoring youth to assist RECEs with the delivery of early learning and care. During this placement, the student will provide onsite coaching and mentoring during regular contact to assist youth in gaining skills, knowledge and confidence. The student will use a strengths-based approach with youth to identify strategies for personal growth and guide them on how to plan and implement engaging activities for children.

Responsibilities:

- Promote the leadership program within Andrew Fleck Children's Services and the community
- Review criteria for leadership programs
- Review applications for potential placements
- Collaborate on what skills and requirements are needed to fulfil placement expectations
- Guide youth through the orientation process and provide information on how to establish a safe and supportive environment for themselves and others
- Develop and publish a handbook for students with expected competencies that are to be met during the program
- Assist youth in developing a repertoire of activities that encourages appreciation for the outdoors
- Identify top priorities that will support successful and enriching experiences
- Lead student orientation
- Observe youth's performance
- Troubleshoot any issues that arise
- Work independently and as part of a team
- Attend placement regularly
- Complete the orientation process
