





Shelter Worker Program Assistant

Bachelor of Early Learning & Child Development Student Placement

Andrew Fleck Children's Services (AFCS) is looking for a student for our Shelter Worker placement opportunity. In this 15-week placement the student will be working directly and indirectly with caregivers, children and parents at various women's shelter locations. The focus of this placement will be on preparing and leading direct/indirect training for the caregivers. The student will act as a pedagogical leader by providing onsite coaching and mentoring during regular contact. In addition, the student will identify and create effective learning opportunities for children and parents with an emphasis on promoting outdoor play.

This is an unpaid placement opportunity. 8 weeks of funding through Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ), an initiative to help youth gain job skills and experience, <u>may be available</u> for qualified students, however funding is unlikely to be confirmed until May 2020. All applicants must be currently enrolled in 3rd year of Bachelor of Early Learning and Community Development Program at Algonquin College for this placement.
