Andrew Fleck Children's Services (AFCS) is looking to hire Summer Program Assistants to work at the Forest Explorers Program and the Ottawa Forest and Nature School! As a Summer Program Assistant, you will be supporting Educators in nurturing child-centred, inquiry driven, interest-led learning through play on the land!

These positions are dependent on receiving funding through Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ), an initiative to help youth gain job skills and experience. Maximum age requirement for candidates to be eligible for the CSJ program is 30 years of age. Note that employees working in childcare centres must be at least 18 years of age. Applicants must also be a Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident.
